MEd and Initial Licensure (and Additional Licensure) in K-12 Art Education Prerequisite List

What are prerequisites?

Prerequisites are foundational courses required in specific content areas for licensure. Candidates are required to hold an undergraduate degree from an accredited institution with appropriate liberal arts/general education coursework and meet the prerequisites below. Prerequisites courses must have a minimum C- grade.

When do prerequisites need to be completed?

It is recommended that all prerequisite coursework is completed prior to starting the program; however, missing prerequisites may also be completed during or directly following the M.Ed./initial License program. Any in-progress coursework would be counted as complete if a transcript with proof of enrollment is provided at the time of application. Please check with your program area adviser before registering for any prerequisite coursework.
